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School Psychologists work to find the best solution for each student and situation. They use different strategies to address student needs and to improve school and district-wide support systems. The services of the School Psychologist are available to all classes/programs within the district. School psychologists are responsible for completing evaluations and re-evaluations of students and assisting in the special education identification and placement process. School Psychologists may also work with students individually and/or in groups. They are also able to apply their expertise to a wide range of student service needs.

Program and Service Activities Provided:

- Collaborate with teachers, parents, and administrators to find effective solutions to learning and behavior problems.
- Help others understand child development and how it affects learning and behavior.
- Strengthen working relationships between teachers, parents, and service providers in the community.
- Evaluate eligibility for special services.
- Assess academic skills and aptitude for learning.
- Determine social-emotional development and mental health status.
- Evaluate learning environments.
- Provide psychological counseling to help resolve interpersonal or family problems that interfere with school performance.
- Work directly with children and their families to help resolve problems in adjustment and learning.
- Provide training in social skills and anger management.
- Help families and schools manage crises such as death, illness, or community trauma.
- Design programs for children at risk of failing at school.
- Collaborate with school staff and community agencies to provide services directed at improving psychological and physical health.
- Use evidence-based research to develop and/or recommend effective interventions.
